1. Scope and Purpose of the Policy

- 1.1 This policy applies to all students and apprentices who choose to study at Blackpool and The Fylde College (B&FC) including former members who have left B&FC with outstanding items. The application of fines and charges is a tool to promote positive behaviour and aims to ensure the fair and effective circulation of resources.
- 1.2 The purpose of this policy is to enhance the availability of resources and to promote equality of access.
- 1.3 This policy has been benchmarked against local, regional and national providers to ensure parity and consistency across the sector.

2. Policy Statement

- 2.1 The policy exists to to ensure fair access to resources and effective circulation amongst the college community by encouraging the return of overdue resources. There may be rare instances when B&FC are left with no choice other than to issue small fines for late returns. Borrowing may be suspended when fines exceed a set limit or until a payment plan is agreed and in place.
- 2.2 The level of charge is based on the fixed loan duration of a particular asset which increases incrementally as the lateness of the return progresses. There is a fixed maximum fine.
- 2.3 College alumni have access to the physical books stock for reference use only, therefore loans are not available.

3 Accountability

- 3.1 The Director for Students is accountable for the updating of this policy.
- 3.2 All users are responsible for renewing or returning items checked out in their name by the return due date.
